Treasurer's Report - P. Bunting

Financial Statements for Year 2016

- The 2016 statements were issued by Kevin A. Dunn, Chartered Accountant June 26th, 2017 and reviewed and approved by Select Vestry July 9th, 2017.
- At the 2016 Annual Vestry Meeting, it was identified that in the Financial Reports through 2015 that though reported annual Net Asset totals balanced to bank records, differences by account (operating, capital and memorial) were an issue. After investigation, the cause was attributed to the accounting software only allowing a single control account for St. Peter's that didn't effectively allow tracking of all inter-account activity. This has now been rectified through a software upgrade that enables income statements for each of the funds to be shown separately with separate tracking of income and expenses (reference Statement of Operations page 5.) Expense reporting is also being realigned to detailed budget line items. Reported transfers between funds reflects the required adjustments to

align the 2016 Financial Statements with each account's 2016 year-end bank statement (reference Statement of Changes in Net Assets page 4)

• Net income for 2016 net of the Music Fund build and Memorial donations was \$8,800. Annual giving net of the music fund build and memorial donations has decreased year over year by some \$8,000 or 18%.

MOTION: It was moved by P. Bunting that the 2016 Financial Statements issued by St Peter's accountant Kevin Dunn be accepted as written.

2017 Expense Budget

- A \$28,000 Expense Budget draft was distributed with the Spring Newsletter. The 2017 budget is based on 2016 actual expenditures (including HST) after elimination of one time charges, plus 13.5% contingency (\$3,400).
- The line item detail was presented for Select Vestry for review and approved July 9th.

MOTION: It was moved by P. Bunting that the budget for St. Peter's on-the-Rock for the year 2017 be approved in the amount of \$28,000 with the condition that any funding requirements that exceed \$28,000 would require the advanced approval of Select Vestry. Reports to provide budget status updates will be made available to the Wardens on an ongoing basis.



Music Scholar's Programme Endowment Fund

- The Music Scholars Fund now stands at \$15,180 given donations from the Walter and Dembroski families plus the art auction. The objective of the fund is to provide annual income of \$500 to support the Music Scholar's Programme. The ultimate objective of the fund will be to enable a \$1,000 annual scholarship.
- After review and agreement by Select Vestry, the fund has been invested by RBC Dominion Securities following the Diocese of Toronto Investment Policy Guidelines (conservative, risk neutral balanced portfolio).
- Given these guidelines, St Peter's has proceeded and invested \$14,180 in the Fidelity Canadian Balanced Class B Fund as recommended by RBC Dominion Securities and hold \$1,000 in cash for 2017/2018 scholarships.

The General Endowment Fund

- This is a new initiative that was discussed last year is to enable families to make bequeathments and other legacy gifts that will enable long term financial support for St Peter's.
- A committee has been convened (. Dobbin, S. Wotherspoon, C. Bunting and P. Bunting) to bring forward a final General Endowment Fund recommendation and guidelines for vestry review and approval.
- A review of options available has concluded that the most suitable investment vehicle for the purpose of a General Endowment Fund is for St Peter's to participate in the Diocese of Toronto Consolidated Trust Fund (CTF). The CTF was specifically created by the Diocese to enable parishes to manage such long term investments. This approach will be dependent on assurances that certain control requirements will be met.
- Once details have been finalized with the Diocese and approved by Select Vestry, details will be fully communicated (Spring Newsletter etc.). If there is immediate interest, please contact the treasurer.

MOTION: It was moved by P. Bunting that Select Vestry is to continue to develop and finalize a General Fund to enable the long term financial support of St Peter's.

Discussion

 A flyer will be prepared by C. Bunting and ready for the newsletter in the spring of 2018 to outline the General Fund for the congregation.

- R. Drake felt it important that the vestry keep control of the funds through RBC vs. Diocese of Toronto's Consolidated Trust Fund.
- It was agreed by the meeting that a financial person be appointed to advise the select vestry on matters concerning investments. R. Drake will be included in the committee along with S. Wotherspoon, P. Bunting and R. Dobbin.

Membership List

- A new software package has been purchased called for maintenance of the mailing lists, donation tracking and tax receipts.
- 219 newsletters were email with 13 rejections
- 127 newsletter mailed with 6 rejections.
- P. Bunting noted that revenue from mailers sent in the spring newsletter is off whereas Sunday collections have increased by 28%. It was recommended that the spring newsletter be mailed to the congregation for 2018 rather than relying on using email to circulate the newsletter as the donation form is in a different colour and this encourages donations.

Signing Officers

Property - D. MacIntyre

The property faired very well over the past winter with no damage to the church or cottage. With the rather rainy summer, it has been difficult to paint various areas because of the damp wood. Unless we see a reasonable period of no rain, any outside painting will have to be done next year. I know this is a concern around the cottage for Ruth.

The small boat dock continues to show deterioration. It will need to be monitored.

Hydro One will be moving the electrical transformer off the hydro pole to a ground position. This is to upgrade the underwater hydro line and reduce the potential for lightning strike. The new position will be close to the lake and should not pose an eye sore. The hydro pole will remain to run the electric cables to the church and cottage. The work will be done towards the end of August or in early September and take about 3-4 hours. The new under water line has already been installed.

I'm pleased to report that Johnny Scace and Charlotte Chambers will return next year as our sextons. Charlotte replaced her brother, Jack, as the sexton this summer.

This is my last year in charge of Property. I have had 8 busy years and I felt it was time to hand the position onto some else. I started off with major repairs to the cottage and a surprise, at the front entrance to the church. Also, new floors were installed in the church and cottage. This was followed by replacement of the big boat dock in preparation for the 100th Anniversary. No sooner had we caught our breath than our attention turned to replacing the roofs on the church and cottage. The shingles showed signs of deterioration and leaks.

I always felt that the clergy cottage was a private residence and the toilet ought not to be used by people simply walking in. Hence, the parishioner washroom was built. Little did I realize the hoops that had to be jumped through; getting appointed by the diocese to represent them to the Township of Selwyn. The irony is the Township didn't even have the island on their maps yet collected their taxes! The washroom has proven very successful.

Finally, I'm happy to announce that Nathan Chambers has agreed to take on the position of Property commencing in 2018. I know he'll do a great job.

I truly thank you for your support.
